If the Marsh grass is not to be dredged in this area, as per Addendum #2, the dredge will not be able to float past/beyond this area. There is an area to be dredged beyond the marsh grass/on the back side of the marsh grass. So the question that has not been answered is that there is material that is proposed to be dredged on the other side (behind) the marsh grass where the dredge can not float.
