it's just right to recycle



what can be recycled?

Convenience centers are for **Georgetown County residents ONLY**.

- Appliances, large (e.g., refrigerators, washers, dryers)
- Batteries, lead-acid (e.g., car, truck, boat)
- Cans (e.g., aluminum, steel)
- Cardboard
- Cooking oil
- Construction and demolition (C&D) debris (See page 7.)
- Electronics, household (e.g., televisions, computers, computer monitors, printers and other electronic equipment)
- Farmer oil (i.e., oil from farm machinery – 55-gallon limit)
- Glass bottles, jars and jugs (brown, green, clear)
- Oil/gasoline mixture
- Paper (e.g., newspaper, inserts)
- Mixed paper (e.g., magazines, unwanted mail, office paper, paperboard, telephone books)
- Motor oil, filters and bottles
- Plastic bottles, jars and jugs (#1-#5)
- Scrap metal
- Tires (NO rims)
- Textiles (e.g., clothing, stuffed animals, linens)
- Yard trimmings

preparing your recyclables

- Rinse bottles, cans and jars.
- Place recyclables in a separate bin from your household trash.
- Flatten cardboard.
- Keep cardboard, magazines and newspapers clean and dry.
- Place loose recyclables in the correct containers at the convenience centers.



what CANNOT be recycled?

- Greasy takeout containers
- Styrofoam
- Aluminum foil
- Yard trimmings in plastic bags
- Plastic bags with recyclables





services & education

other services at the landfill

Georgetown County's Landfill Convenience Center, located at 201 Landfill Drive, offers residents the services listed below.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW) COLLECTION

HHW includes paint, fertilizer and cleaners.

They should be in their original containers and properly labeled. Tighten caps and lids. Never mix chemicals.

HHW is accepted year round at the Landfill Convenience Center as well as bi-annual collection events throughout the county.



CARPET RECYCLING

Carpet and carpet padding are accepted at the landfill as long as they are free of debris (e.g., carpet nails, boards, any other debris).



BUSINESS PAPER RECYCLING PROGRAM

Georgetown County offers free paper and cardboard recycling for local businesses. This program provides recycling containers for weekly collection of office paper and cardboard.

educational opportunities

The Environmental Education Center at the landfill is open to schools and other groups (by appointment) that want to learn about waste management and the environment.

LANDFILL TOURS

What happens to your garbage? Find out by taking your class or organization on a landfill tour.

EAGLE TOURS

The landfill is home to many species of local birds including black vultures, turkey vultures and bald eagles. Eagle tours are regularly scheduled between November and April.



bad bags

Do not place recyclables or yard trimmings in plastic bags. Place them loose in collection containers. Plastic bags can be recycled at Pawleys Island, Murrells Inlet and Johnson Road convenience centers or local grocery stores.
